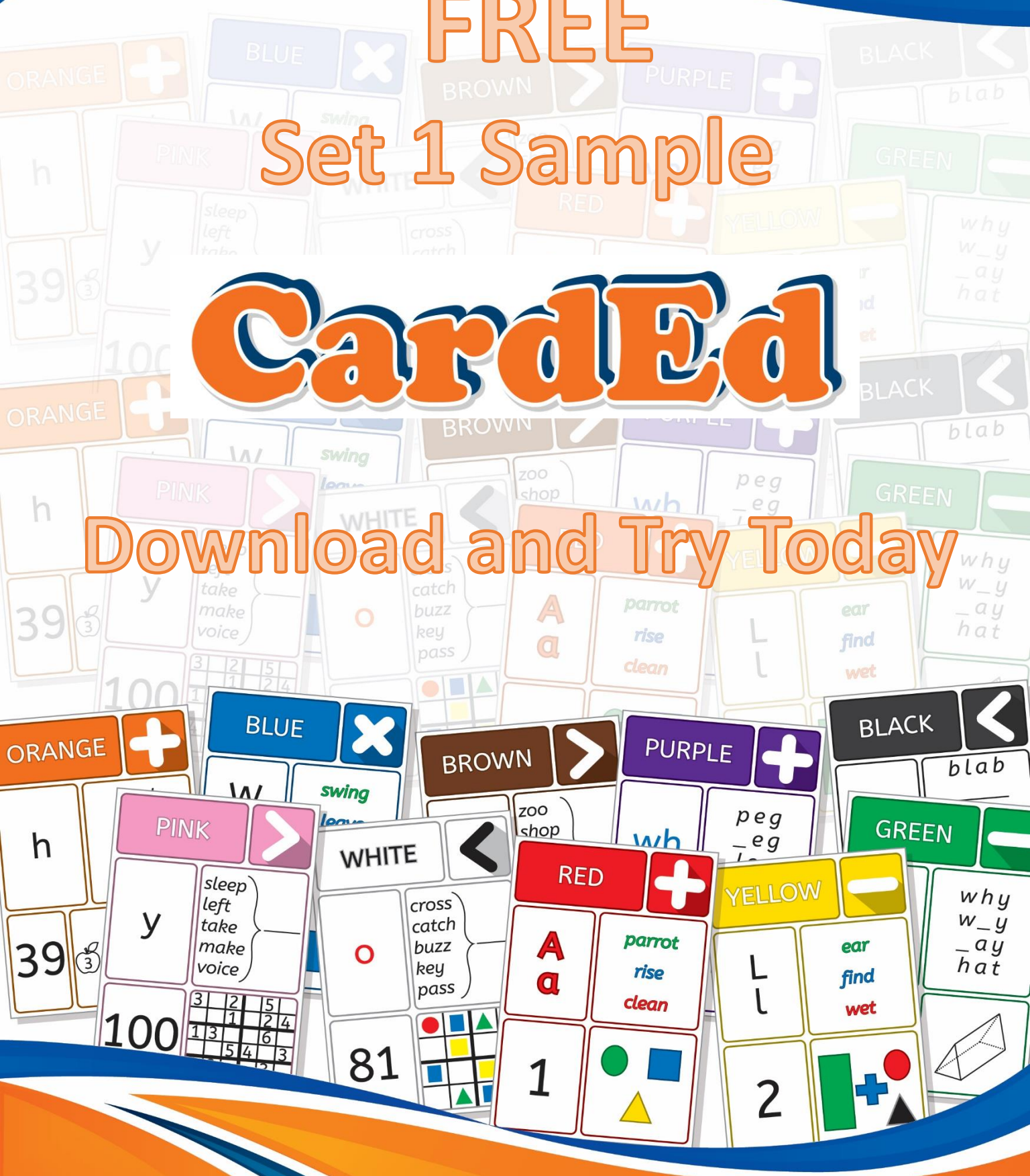

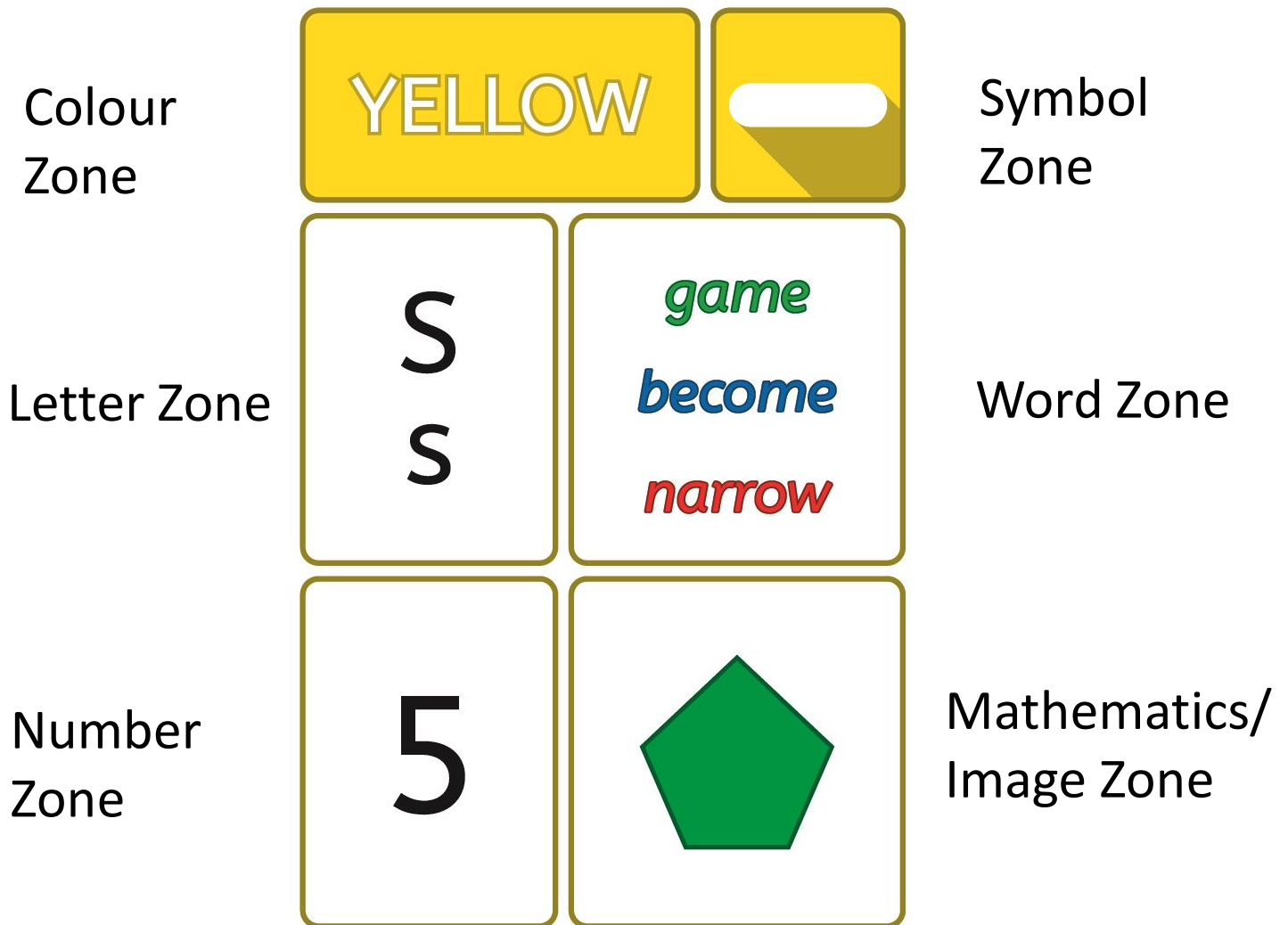

Introduction

- Thank you for downloading this CardEd Set 1 Sample.
- CardEd has been designed for use in the classroom, at home, or when out-an-about. They are great for use individually, with a small group, or with a whole class. CardEd activities can be completed as individual challenges, as collaborative activities in teams, or in a competitive way as timed challenges.
- Each CardEd deck features 50 cards. A separate activity guide gives an overview of ideas for using the cards. All cards feature the same layout with 6 zones (Colour, Symbol, Letter, Word, Number, and Mathematics/Image). As such, there are a myriad of uses for CardEd, and they can be used with children of different ages. Simply varying the level of questioning and adding more elements/multi-step instructions will increase the level of challenge in each activity.
- This download features one of the cards and a selection of our ideas and activities for using it. There are a mix of ideas depending on whether the cards are being used at home or at school and according to the age of the child/ren they are being used with.
- Use a timer for some of these challenges if an extra element of competition is desired. It will be helpful for children to have paper on which to write/draw their responses.

CardEd Layout



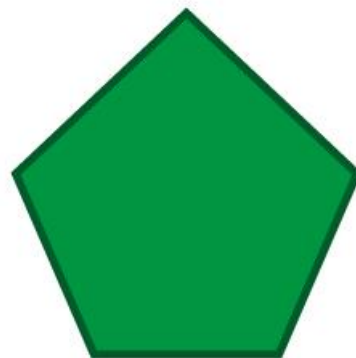

Colour Zone Activity Ideas

Have the child identify the Colour Zone.

- **Treasure Hunt Activities:**

- Gather all the yellow things you can find in your toybox.
- Draw the yellow things you can see in the classroom.
- Point out and count the yellow things you can see in the supermarket.

- **Thinking Activities:**

- How many yellow things can you name?

- **General Knowledge:**

- Do you know the names of any shades of yellow?
- Do you know any yellow cartoon characters?
- Where is the Yellow River located?
- Can you think of any flags that have yellow on them?
- In what fictional land is there a yellow brick road? Who wrote about this fictional land? Do you know any characters to be found there?

- **Vocabulary/Language Development:**

- What is meant by being yellow-bellied?
- What smaller words can you see in yellow?
- Rearrange the letters in yellow to make some new words.

Letter Zone Activity Ideas

Have child identify the Letter Zone.

- Ask them to name the letter and say its sound.
- Can they say the alphabet with all letters in the correct place?
- Can they name the letters before and after S?
- Can they write the letter S correctly?

*Use letter, sound, or both in asking questions.

• Treasure Hunt Activities

- How many things beginning with S can you find at home?
- Can you create a set of things with /s/ (sound) from items in the classroom?

• Thinking Activities:

- How many things beginning with /s/ can you name?
- How many household objects/school items/storybook or cartoon characters beginning with S can you think of?

• General Knowledge:

- Can you think of someone famous with the initials SS?

Letter Zone Activity Ideas

- **Vocabulary/Language Development:**

- How many words beginning with S can you write?
- How many words beginning and ending with S can you think of?

Provide definitions and see if the child can provide the word.

- **Beginning with S, what:**

- is a man-made device orbiting in space?
- is another name for the tibia?
- is a triangle with 3 unequal sides?
- is scribbled writing?

- **Beginning and ending with S, what:**

- are small onions used in coking?
- is a word used to describe someone who is very conscientious?
- means giving cause for concern?
- is a synonym for delicious?

Number Zone Activity Ideas

Have child identify the Number Zone.

- Can they count up to the number?
- Do they know the number word before/after 5?
- Can they show 5 on their fingers?
- Can they show 5 on a 10-frame?
- Can they create a set of 5 objects?
- Can they write 5 correctly?
- Do they know the number bonds to 5? Can they tell you what needs to go along with a number e.g. 2 to make 5?
- Can they count in 5s?
- Can they double 5?
- Do they know what 5 is half, third, quarter, fifth etc. of?

• Treasure Hunt Activities:

- Can you create a set of 5 similar objects and tell me why you put them together?
- Can you find 5 leaves and put them in order from smallest to biggest?
- Can you find 5 things you write with and put them in order from longest to shortest?

Number Zone Activity Ideas

- **Thinking Activities:**

- What comes in sets of 5 e.g. senses?

- **General Knowledge:**

- What are the 5 vowels?
- What are the colours of the 5 Olympic rings?
- What are the 5 major oceans?
- What 5 sports are in a pentathlon?
- What symbol represents 5 in Roman numerals?
- What is a 5-sided shape known as?

- **Language Development:**

- What does it mean to 'take five'?
- What (usually funny) 5-line poems have a rhyme scheme A-A-B-B-A?

Symbol Zone Activity Ideas

Have child identify the symbol in the Symbol Zone.

- What is the name of this symbol?
- What other words are used for this symbol?
- Can you make up a written sum using the symbol?
- Can you create a word problem featuring this symbol?
- If I use this symbol in a sum, should I expect an increase or decrease?

Word Zone Activity Ideas

Set 1 cards feature a noun, verb, and adjective in the word zone.

Have child read the words in the Word Zone.

- Can they use the words in sentences that make sense?
- Can they define the words?
- Can they classify the words into noun, verb, or adjective?
How do they know?
- Can they provide synonyms or antonyms for any of the words on the card?

- **Thinking Activities:**

- How many games can you think of?

- **Creative Thinking:**

- Can you design a board game/ball game? Teach a friend to play it.

- **General Knowledge:**

- What playground games do you think were common 50 years ago?

Word Zone Activity Ideas

- **Language Development:**

- What is the past tense of become?
- What is meant by becoming? What is the opposite of becoming? Create a list of becoming/unbecoming behaviours.
- What is the opposite of narrow?
- What is a narrowboat?
- What is your favourite game? Why?
- Explain the rules of your favourite game?
- Change one letter in game, become, and narrow to make new words.
- Use game, become, and narrow as root words to create longer words.

Mathematical/Image Zone Activity Ideas

Have the child identify the shape in the Mathematical/Image Zone.

- Can they name the shape?
- Can they outline the properties of the shape?
- Can they draw the shape?
- Can they draw a 3D version of the shape?

- **Thinking Activities:**

- Can you think of anything that is pentagon-shaped?

- **General Knowledge:**

- What US department is based at The Pentagon?

- **Language Development:**

- 'Penta' means five/having five. What is the origin of this word?
- How many words beginning with 'penta' can you think of?

Multi-Zone Activity Ideas

Letter/Colour Zone:

- How many yellow things beginning with S can you find?

Number/Colour Zone:

- Can you name 5 yellow fruits/vegetables?

Letter/Number Zone:

- Can you name 5 animals/places beginning with S?

Letter/Number/Colour Zone:

- Can you name 5 yellow household objects beginning with S?

Number/Shape:

- What do you get if you add the number of edges on the shape to the number on the card and double it?

Working Memory:

An excellent challenge is to display the card for a number of seconds, screen it, and ask the child to re-create it.
