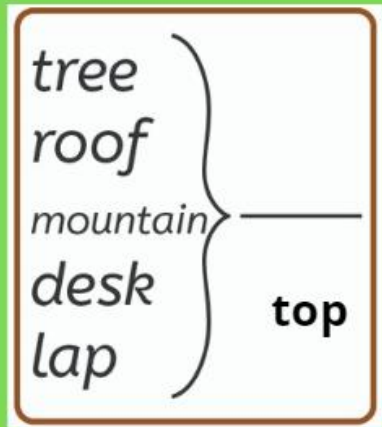
Word Zone
